# What type of childhood did you have and how has it influenced who you are today?

My childhood was filled with creativity, curiosity, and responsibility. I learnt early to lead, to nurture, and to serve. Those early experiences shaped my drive, discipline, resilience, community building skills and my passion for helping others grow.

Starting with just \$40 to building a seven-figure enterprise, what were some key turning points in your career and how has your business evolved till date?

My journey began with nothing but faith, a borrowed laptop, and \$40TT, money that wasn't even earmarked for a business. It was grocery money. It was a need to stay financially stable and be present with my daughters as I felt I was visiting their lives because I was so busy with work and day to day responsibilities. But when you're called to purpose, you feel it in your bones. I used that \$40 to start my first business and from there, I built slowly, intentionally, with discipline, resilience and relentless consistency. The major turning point came when I shifted from hustling to strategising. Once I embraced systems, mindset work, and aligned my business with my purpose, everything accelerated. That's when the Positioned to Propel Academy (PTPA) was born — and from there, the work expanded into 30+ countries across the Caribbean, the U.S., Canada the U.K., and Africa. Going from \$40 to seven figures wasn't luck, it was clarity, community, and courage... the trifecta that still shapes my work today.

Personal experiences shaping your coaching philosophy
Every part of my life, the struggles, disappointments, betrayals, triumphs, taught me that success without wellness is self-destruction in disguise. I learnt the hard way that hustle culture leads to burnout, not breakthrough. My coaching philosophy is rooted in

wholeness. I don't teach women to chase success; I teach them to build a life that sustains success. My experience as a mother, educator, entrepreneur, and woman rediscovering her own worth, guides every client interaction. My story is the blueprint for my philosophy: Heal first. Align next. Learn. Build always.

Core components of the "Life by Design Framework," and how it is helping women entrepreneurs achieve success

## The Life by Design Framework is built on four pillars:

1. Clarity: Knowing who you are, what you want, and why it matters.

- **2. Alignment:** Making decisions that honour your purpose, not your pressure. We design lives we enjoy, not endure.
- **3. Systems:** Creating structure so your business supports your life, not the other way around.
- **4. Embodiment:** Becoming the woman you envision through mindset, habits, and self-trust.

This framework helps women shift from overwhelm to ownership. When you design your life intentionally, business growth becomes a natural extension of inner transformation.

When your business took a leap, how did changing your mindset set you up for greater success?





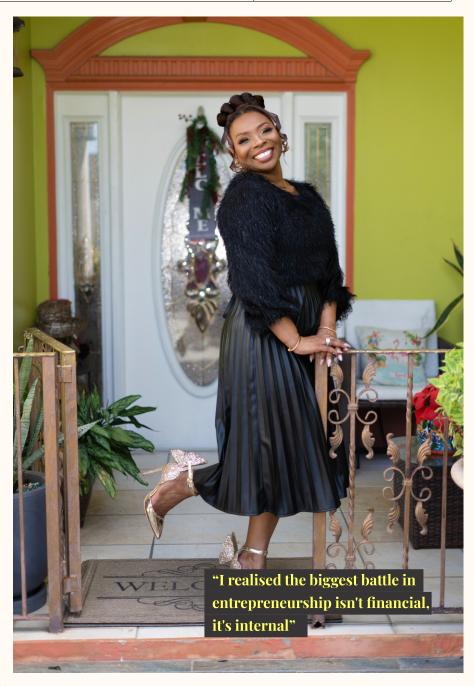
I realised the biggest battle in entrepreneurship isn't financial, it's internal. Once I stopped negotiating with my limitations and started partnering with my identity and capabilities, everything changed. I had to become the woman I promised myself to become. That mindset shift unlocked room for accelerated growth, expansion and abundance, and that's when my quantum leap happened.

# As a mentor for women entrepreneurs, what common challenges do you see, and how do you help them overcome these obstacles?

## The four most common challenges are:

Lack of clarity Imposter syndrome Fear of visibility Trying to do everything alone

I help women overcome these by teaching strategy, breaking belief barriers, community-building, and most importantly, self-belief. Women don't need more hustle — they need support, direction, and structure. The power of a confident woman Women experience a lot of challenges in the business terrain. I will share an experience. I went to a business networking event. And like it is with such gatherings, opportunities always present themselves, and I got one, but I was openly questioned by a prospective client about my capability because I was the only woman at the table. That didn't make me shrink, it boosted my confidence and I proved my value calmly and assuredly. Guess what? At the end of it all, his disbelief changed to respect. Experiences like these will always happen, especially to women. We must learn how to respond to skepticism under pressure. Such experiences just show that it is important to know your onions and always be prepared, embrace optimum composure and poise to deliver what you carry on the inside of you about your business, regardless of the circumstance.

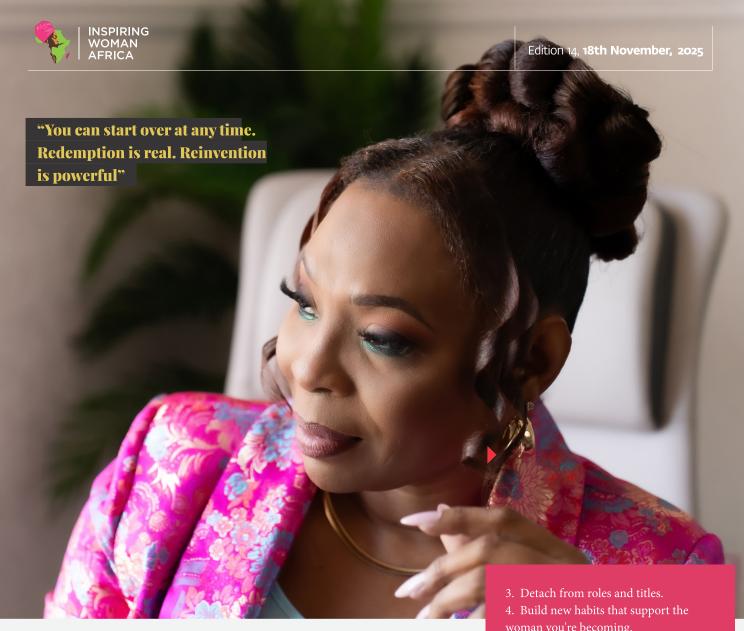


### What peculiar challenges have you observed with women who lead?

From my point of view, I have observed that, among other challenges, women who lead are burdened with

expectations from society. This can be a distraction as it puts them in a position of the pressure of balancing being emphatic (as the situation demands) and being congenial. What happens as a result of this is that women are then positioned to consistently prove their capability. There is also the matter of work-life balance, which men aren't asked. So, the challenges with women leaders are there but there is grace to go through each of those challenges. It doesn't change the fact that they exist, it just means we need grace and grit to overcome them.



#### Business goals and family commitments, where is the meeting point?

At the beginning, balancing both was perplexing. It took a lot from me and was draining. I believe it took a great toll on me because I wanted to do all- be a great mother to my daughters, a good wife, be there for family and friends. However, I also had a great pull towards building a prosperous business. These expectations came heavy on my shoulders and it often led to feeling guilty, being tired and severe burnout became the order of the day because I wanted to be there for everybody.

The only thing that made me pause to do a rethink was a health scare and that came from severe exhaustion. That was my wakeup call. I realised that anything I do shouldn't be at the detriment of my health. It was an eye opener and I started to prioritise my life and shared it with my husband and children, who also got involved in my business. This decision produced positive results. I was indeed excited when I started seeing my daughters involved at my live events.

#### What is the greatest lesson life has taught you?

That you can start over at any time. Redemption is real. Reinvention is powerful. And God always uses every chapter, even the painful ones, to prepare you for purpose and position you to propel.

#### Practical steps you recommend for women looking to reclaim their power and rewrite their professional narratives:

- 1. Get quiet; listen to your life.
- 2. Identify the story you've been living and the story you want to live.

Focus on legacy, not just profits

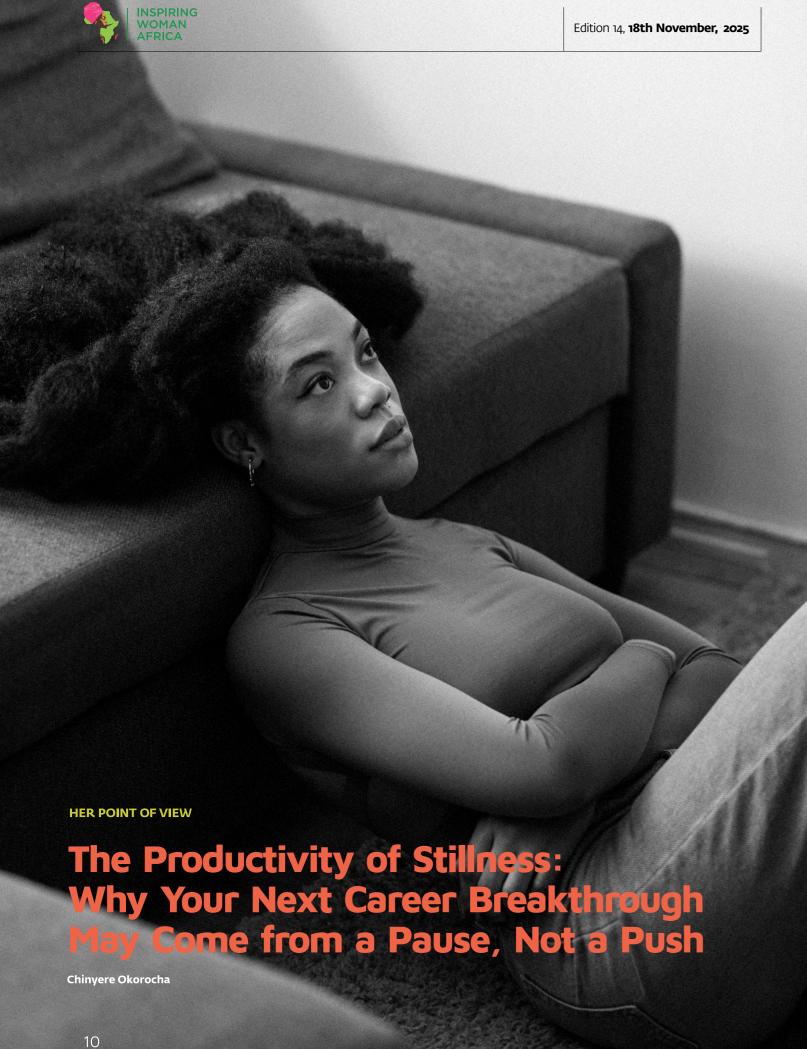
#### What day will you never forget and why?

This is how clarity is cultivated. This is how careers evolve.

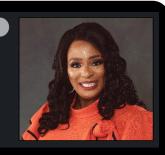

**Emotional Intelligence** as a Leadership Superpower

here was a time when leadership was measured exclusively

by technical brilliance, academic pedigree, and strategic vision. But in today's boardrooms, project teams, and executive corridors, there is a quieter (yet more powerful) currency at play. It is called emotional intelligence. And it is, quite frankly, a leadership superpower.

Because in a world where people are navigating pressures, personality clashes, cultural differences, and life's hidden burdens, it is not just what you know that sets you apart, but how well you understand and manage the human dynamic.

#### When IO Is not Enough

Many high-performing professionals are promoted based on competence, only to struggle with influence. They lead with logic, but not with empathy. They drive performance, but bruise people in the process. And slowly, they lose trust.

This is the Achilles' heel of leadership without emotional intelligence.

Daniel Goleman, who popularized the concept, broke emotional intelligence (EQ) down into five core components: self-awareness, self-regulation, motivation, empathy, and social skill. These are not "soft" skills, they are core competencies for anyone tasked

#### The Cost of Emotional Illiteracy

I have seen entire teams unravel because of a leader's inability to read the room.

Brilliant ideas crushed by arrogance. Talented people walking away because they felt unseen. Conflict escalated because no one paused to listen, reflect, or de-escalate.

merely survive.

**Decision-Making:** Emotionally intelligent leaders do not just react. They respond. They know when to pause. They ask for context. They resist the temptation to lead from ego or fear.

Their decisions are grounded in wisdom, not just instinct.

**Conflict Resolution:** No workplace is without tension. But emotionally intelligent leaders do not avoid conflict. They navigate it. They separate issue from identity. They stay grounded in conversations that would rattle others. They mediate, not manipulate. Influence and Presence: We follow

leaders who see us. Who affirm value without flattery. Who bring calm to chaos. Who can challenge us without crushing us. That is not charisma. That is EQ.

#### The Spiritual Lens

As a woman of faith, I have come to see emotional intelligence as a spiritual discipline. The Bible says in Proverbs 16:32, "He who is slow to anger is better than the mighty, and he who rules his spirit than he who captures a city." Leadership is not only external. It begins with the internal. If we cannot govern ourselves, we cannot govern others. Jesus Himself modelled this. He noticed pain others ignored. He asked questions before offering solutions. He wept with the grieving, paused for the broken, confronted hypocrisy, and still spoke truth in love.

That is the ultimate emotional intelligence.

#### Leading with Heart and Clarity

As executives, we often face enormous pressure, deadlines, politics, tough calls. It is tempting to harden ourselves emotionally just to survive. But numbing our emotional intelligence is not strength, it is a liability.

We must learn to lead with both heart and clarity. To be tough on issues, but tender with people. To self-regulate so we do not weaponise our moods. To develop social awareness that makes every person in the room feel seen and safe.

Because leadership is not about managing outputs. It is about inspiring people, and people are emotional beings.

#### **Final Thoughts**

In today's complex workplaces, IQ may get you hired. But EQ is what sustains your leadership. It is what allows you to manage change without chaos. To navigate politics without pettiness. To build teams that do not just comply, but commit.

And in the end, it is not just your brilliance they will remember, but how you made them feel. So sharpen your mind. Yes. But also, tend to your heart. Because emotional intelligence is not soft. It is supernatural strength, practiced with grace.

Set up automatic savings or investments. Remove the need to "remember." Systems protect you from emotional decisions.

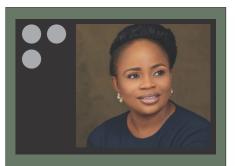
#### 3. Replace Comparison with Consistency

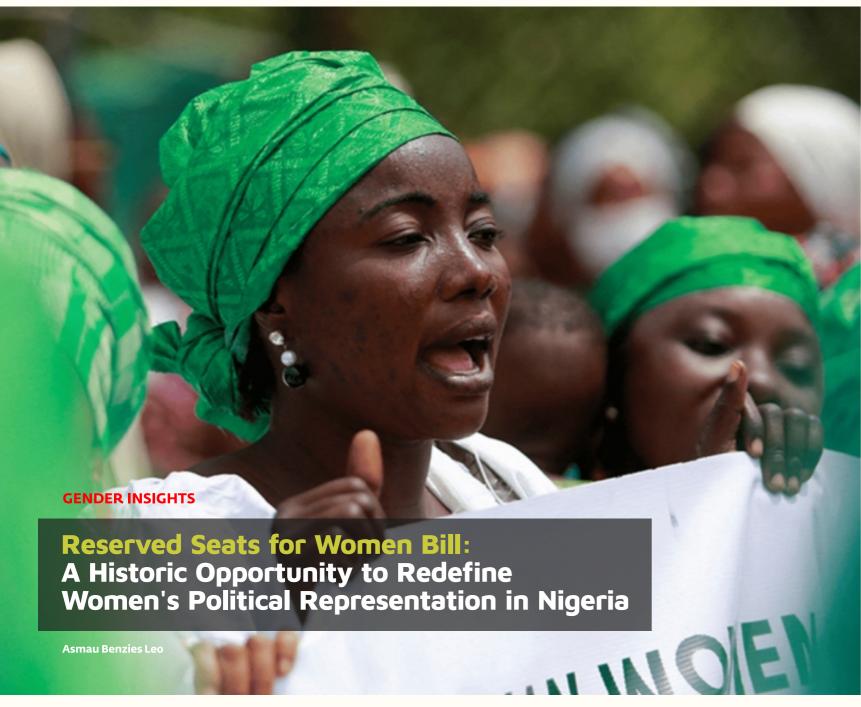

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November 17, 2025, the public hearing on constitutional amendments and amongst the top considerations was the Reserved Seats for Women Bill. Women across the country are uniting behind what could become one of the

Women Bill. Women across the country are uniting behind what could become one of the most transformative legislative reforms in Nigeria's democratic history. The Bill, which seeks to amend the 1999 Constitution to create special seats reserved exclusively for women in

federal and state legislatures, this represents more than a political reform, it is a social justice imperative and a long overdue corrective measure to decades of structural exclusion of women from decision making spaces.

For years, Nigerian women have remained severely under-represented in governance. Despite making up roughly half of the country's population, women currently occupy less than 6% of seats in the National Assembly and fewer than 5% in State Houses of Assembly. The 2023 general elections saw only 17 women

elected into the 469 member National Assembly, one of the lowest figures in Africa. This under-representation not only undermines Nigeria's democratic ideals but also denies the nation the benefits of diverse leadership and inclusive policy making.

The Reserved Seats for Women Bill, sometimes referred to as the "Special or Additional Seats Bill," proposes to reserve one additional seat for women in each state and the Federal Capital Territory in both the Senate and the House of Representatives. At

the state level, the Bill proposes three additional seats per State House of Assembly, one per senatorial district. More importantly, these new seats will not displace existing lawmakers but rather expand the legislative structure to ensure greater inclusion. The Bill also includes a review clause after four electoral cycles (16 years) to assess progress and determine whether the measure should continue or be adjusted.

The public hearing presents women an unprecedented opportunity to make their voices heard. Civil society organisations, women's networks, academia, and traditional and religious leaders presenting memoranda in support of the Bill, highlighting its potential to advance gender equity, deepen democracy, and strengthen governance. This is about women moving from the margins to the mainstream of political participation, bridging the gap between constitutional promises and lived realities.

#### Why This Bill Matters for Nigerian Women

Beyond numerical representation, the Reserved Seats Bill holds immense transformative potential for women's empowerment and national development. Representation matters, women in politics champion issues that affect families and communities, such as education, healthcare, gender-based violence (GBV), maternal health, and inclusive economic policies. Evidence from countries such as Rwanda, Tanzania, and Senegal, where similar temporary special measures exist, shows that women's participation has led to stronger social legislation and more accountable governance.

In Nigeria's context, the Bill aligns with the 35 per cent Affirmative Action provision as enshrined in the National Gender Policy and Nigeria's commitments under UN Security Council Resolution 1325 on Women, Peace and Security. It reinforces the principle that women's participation is not a privilege but a constitutional and democratic right. By creating a constitutional pathway for women's entry into politics, the Bill seeks

to dismantle deep seated cultural, economic, and structural barriers that have historically kept women out of competitive politics.

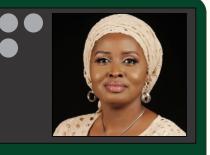
Furthermore, women's increased representation would enhance policy responsiveness to gender related challenges. Legislatures with more women tend to prioritise laws on GBV prevention, social protection, education, and equitable budgeting. With insecurity, unemployment, and poverty disproportionately affecting women and girls, inclusive representation will make governance more reflective of citizens' realities.

#### The Path Ahead: A Call to Action

The hearing is not merely a procedural formality; it is a defining moment for Nigeria's democracy. It provides an opportunity for every stakeholder, lawmakers, political parties, civil society, and citizens to reflect on what inclusive governance truly means. Supporting this Bill is not about displacing men but about strengthening Nigeria's democratic foundations and ensuring that no gender is left behind in nation building.

The National Assembly must therefore demonstrate courage and foresight by listening to the voices of conscience and passing the Bill without delay. For Nigeria to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), particularly Goal 5 on Gender Equality and Goal 16 on Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions, the participation of women at all levels of governance is indispensable.

The result of this convergence and public hearing should be that women across Nigeria; rural and urban, young and old, spoke out as one voice. The Reserved Seats for Women Bill should not just be a women's issue; it must be a national development priority. By passing this Bill, Nigeria will take a historic step toward inclusive democracy, gender justice, and a future where women's voices shape the destiny of the nation.

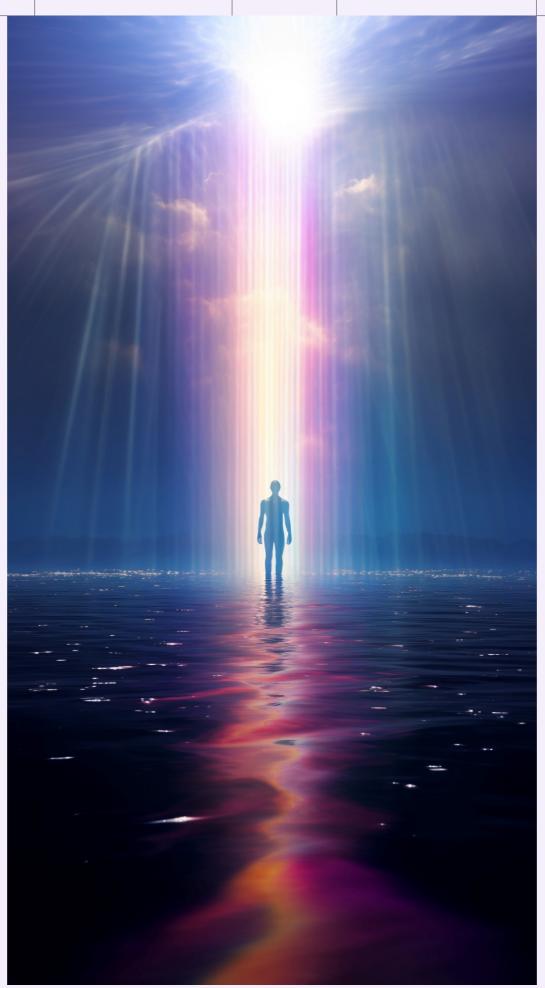
When you know your "why," even the hardest seasons become sacred classrooms.

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does not begin and end on the internet, or social media, as the case may be. It is a means to an end, not the end itself. Therefore, attempting to keep up with the Joneses may get you stuck faster than it'll liberate you. That said, here are 4 strategies to help you position for global leadership;

Understand your Purpose and Vision. This is the first step to showing up in a noisy and interconnected world. We often make the mistake of sitting in one position and 'looking for a purpose'. But, as Oluwatoyin Banjo put it, you find purpose in iteration, not stagnation. What is that nudge in your mind, that one activity you take so much delight in, or that one problem that keeps bugging you? Purpose shows up when you respond to your inner voice. It's not something you find on the streets of Instagram or in the hollows of comparison. It becomes clear when you apply yourself, serve, and stay true to your hunch.

Document your Journey. Here, social media is a relevant tool to build a digital footprint. This isn't about showing up perfectly curated; it is evolving in real time. Besides building thought leadership, or an online community, you'll also be amazed when you see how quickly you're growing. How many times have you been nostalgic when Facebook brings up your post from 3 years ago? Things like that help you stay grounded. As one of the speakers, Akan Imoh, put it, 'you're too broke to be anonymous'.

Take pictures, and videos of moments that matter. Don't be caught in regret when you're asked to display evidence of your work.

Know your Work People will defer to your expertise, regardless of your age. It means you have to be seasoned in whatever industry you choose to play in. Think about a time when someone had you under a trance because of the depth of knowledge they displayed about a topic. That was how I felt when Tolulope Makinwa spoke about global

leadership; it wasn't just what she said but the level of passion, depth and conviction in her voice. And how do you attain that level of knowledge, by applying and exerting yourself. It's not enough to read tweets about a topic, but actually doing the research and putting in the work. That leads to the next strategy.

Do Two Levels Above to Get Noticed. Do so much work that it makes no sense if you don't succeed. This lies in the tenacity and consistency that you approach your work with. This means rising above the noise by consistently exceeding expectations. Oluwatoyin puts it well: "Excellence isn't perfection; it is stewardship." It's the careful management of something entrusted in your care. Pay attention to details, commit to the process, and let your results speak before your resume does.

Finally, global leadership goes beyond visibility, it's the intersection of your voice, your vision, and the value you offer the world. Globalisation may have democratised access, but you must pair it with depth and performance to remain relevant. Start where you are; the world doesn't reward global dreams built on local neglect.

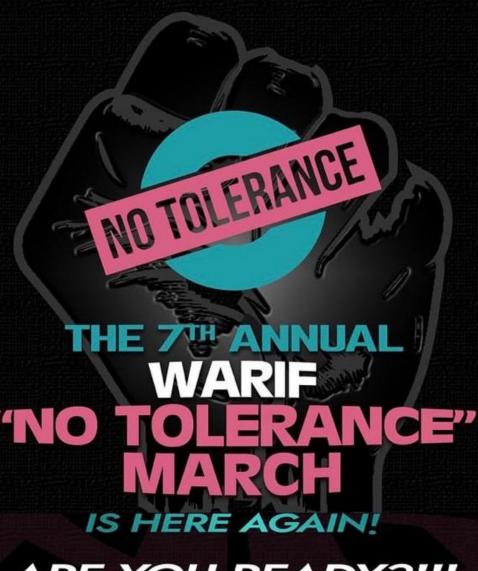
